We're thrilled to introduce you to Pick a Reading Partner (PARP), a fantastic reading program proudly sponsored by the Okte PTA. The PARP program brings parents or any special person in a child's life together to help foster a love for reading in children.

• Our theme for this year is "Leap Into Reading!" We're kicking off the program on Thursday, February 29 (Leap Day!), and it will run until Sunday, March 31, 2024.

#### Let's use PARP to discuss the vital role reading plays in our families and homes.

- Share your favorite authors and characters. Talk about how you choose books (or magazines, newspapers, websites, etc.) and what makes them your favorite.
- Explore other PARP activities like:
  - o Playing reading-based games (trivia, Bananagrams, Scrabble, etc.).
  - Researching and reading about shared interests.
  - Learning new things together online.

The important thing is that your student is picking a reading partner and feels like reading is funduring each chosen activity.

- Students are asked to participate in any reading activity with a partner on your Reading Log for 21 days during the PARP program period (February 29 -March 31.) Remember to jot down the reading activity and partner on the attached PARP Reading Log.
- If your student completes 21 days of reading with a partner (from February 29 -March 31), they can pick a book from our special PARP book prize collection! Let us know which book you'd like on your PARP Reading Log.

# PICK A READING PARTNER READING IDEAS

# Use one of these reading ideas or come up with your own. Any type of reading counts for PARP.

- Visit the public or a little library and read a book there!
- Read with a stuffed animal or a pet.
- Read the lyrics from your favorite song.
- Read to someone younger or older than you.
- Read in your pajamas.
- Read aloud while taking a short drive.
- Read by flashlight!
- Read with your partner in a fort!
- Read in the bathtub (no water!)
- Beach Party! Read on a towel or a blanket.
- Read a poem.
- Read about a place you want to visit.
- Dr. Suess' birthday is in March. Read a Dr. Suess book.
- Play a word game such as Wordle, Scrabble, Mad Libs, or Boggle.
- Take turns reading. You read a page to your partner. Then, your partner reads a page.
- Read a book about the seasons to celebrate Spring starting in March.
- Read jokes from a book or a website!

- Read a book with a title that starts with a letter in your first name.
- Read a recipe and then make something yummy for your family.
- Read while having a snack.
- Make reading an experience. For example, read a book about animals then take a trip to a zoo or aquarium.
- Read out loud with silly voices.
- Read while waiting for something.
- Read a magazine or a newspaper.
- Read the instructions for your favorite game, then play!
- Read a non-fiction book.
- Read in your favorite place in your home.
- Read outside!
- Take a walk and read the street signs along the way.
- Read to someone over Facetime, Zoom or Google Meet.
- Read a book or magazine with Shen colors (green or white) on the cover.
- Read a book that was made into a movie, then watch the movie!
- Read anything, anytime, anywhere!



#### Earn a special PARP prize when you participate in the PARP reading program!


- Students who complete 21 reading sessions (from February 29 to March 31) with a partner qualify for one of the PARP prize books listed below.

#### The Couch Potato





#### Dog Man: The Scarlet Shedder




